Leaders and volunteers

For the first time, the BIOB community festival was supported by a team of volunteers.

In addition to a team of volunteers from the DP World Tour,
Marlwood School in Bristol have been trained and
delivering on UYD within their school. They saw it as a
great opportunity to get involved and support a large
community event.

The school brought 6 of their pupils along with PE teacher to the event, supporting the festival and gaining valuable experience of a community sports event.









Leaders and volunteers

The Marlwood pupils have been undertaking a leadership programme with their PE teacher, supported by The Golf Foundation.

To date they have:

- Attended 5 sessions of golf leadership
- Learned about the 9 mental toughness tools in UYD
- Delivered peer led sessions using some of these tools
- Supported the BIOB Community festival by leading on their own activity stations whilst offering support to the children



Leaders and volunteers

Head of PE at Marlwood School Matt Richards outlined the progress the students had made -

"The students have been fortunate enough to have Tom come into school to deliver some leadership training and the Unleash Your Drive mental toughness tools. These have been invaluable for the students for not only delivering to others, but for their own development. In additon to this, the opportunity to put into practice the skills they have picked up at a large scale community festival - at The British Masters is something they will not forget in a hurry! We are so gtareful for the opportunity and look forward to supporting more of these initiatives in future"





Young Ambassador Programme

Adopting the Young Ambassador values of Inspiring, Inclusive and Innovative, this year we benefitted from Megan helping to lead on delivery of the festival. Megan's role was to oversee the festival, time keeping, activity rotations and to ensure young leaders were happy.

Megan was a fantastic ambassador and awarded two Skills for Life medals to groups who displayed the YA values during the festival. Megan then presented these to the groups during the prize giving.
